- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **"tender"** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **"price"** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **"rand value"** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and

1. INTRODUCTION

Quotations are hereby called for consultants to compile the Denneburg Heritage Survey and lodge an Exemption Application for the surveyed area to Heritage Western Cape on behalf of Drakenstein Municipality.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this project is to compile a heritage survey of Denneburg Residential Neighborhood to establish if there is any heritage significance and identify and grade any heritage resources in line with the existing policies of Heritage Western Cape. Thereafter, an exemption application must be prepared for submission to Heritage Western Cape for the exemption of structures older than 60 years, which have not been graded, from the provisions of Section 34 and 38 of the National Heritage Resources Act No. 25 of 1999. The exemption submission will be completed by the municipality.

3. BACKGROUND

Drakenstein Municipality's Spatial Development Framework (SDF) is intended to provide planning systems and approaches, through which the Municipality can achieve its spatial development vision. The SDF is based on seven interlinking themes that have been identified, and that provide the overall spatial planning guidance.

The protection and promotion of heritage and cultural landscapes is one of the key spatial themes of the SDF and focuses on promoting and protecting the scenic and rural landscapes, as well as conserving cultural landscapes and heritage resources of the Drakenstein Municipality.

Klein Drakenstein Road Central Improvement District is considered a big move within the spatial priority area of Paarl East- West Integration Corridor, which is one of five spatial priority areas identified within the SDF.

The cultural heritage of Paarl East did not form part of the approved Drakenstein Heritage Survey 2013. However, the Paarl East area exhibits more than 300 years of development and a unique cultural history. The area also has many linkages to the history of Paarl and the development of the town. Furthermore, the area exhibits its own unique cultural heritage corridor along Klein Drakenstein Road, which is of great social significance to the local community.

The area is characterised by pockets of historic urban fabric surrounded by modern urban infill development, which has little or no heritage significance.

The suburb of Denneburg is placed at the entrance to Klein Drakenstein Road and is considered one of the oldest suburbs in Paarl East.

Taking the above into consideration, it can be concluded that heritage survey and exemption application for the suburb of Denneburg is an important intervention in terms of the spatial themes outlined within the SDF.

4. TERMS OF REFERENCE

4.1 Project Brief
